

KFCA LANDSCAPING – BUSHES AND SHRUBS:

Evergreens Shrubs:

- **Cherry laurel**—The upright and fast growth habit of the evergreen cherry laurel bushes make these perfect for flowering hedges or specimen bushes.
- **Boxwoods:** Evergreen [ornamental shrubs](#) with small oval glossy evergreen leaves – these shrubs grow to medium size.
- **Dwarf boxwood (*Buxus*)**— Low maintenance, evergreen shrub with a rounded growth that is suitable for growing as a specimen plant in the front yard or [low hedge](#).
- **Green Velvet Boxwood** — Green Velvet Boxwood is the perfect boxwood choice for round specimens or hedges. This hybrid variety has the tough genes of the Korean boxwood to help it survive cold winters without damage, and always looks fresh and a rich green color in every season of the year. It can be left unclipped to naturally form a dense, rounded shrub about 3' tall and across. It can be clipped into round balls of any size, for planting in pots or in groups in the garden. It can also be planted in a row to make a dense, evergreen hedge anything from 12 inches to 3 feet tall.
- **Skip Laurel Skip Laurel (*Prunus laurocerasus* 'Schipkaensis')**: is an upright, vigorous laurel also known as “West Coast Skip” laurel. Skip has glossy foliage and highly fragrant white blossoms in spring and is a dense, evergreen shrub. When planted in a mass makes an excellent screen or hedge. Skip grows from 10' to 15' in height with spreads 6' to 7' wide. Grows best in moist, but well-drained soil. Plant 2-3 ft apart to create a dense hedge.
- **Itea** — Itea Little Henry or Dwarf Sweetspire is as colorful as burning bushes in the fall, but native to North America which means its pollinator friendly! 2-3' at maturity.
- **Japanese Holly** — an easy to grow dense, low growing, compact, mounding shrub with a dark evergreen green foliage that is perfect for use as a low hedge. 5-6' tall at maturity.
