KIDS & GUNS: STOP, DON'T TOUCH, GET AWAY, TELL AN ADULT

Domestic gun sales have surged in recent years.

Even if your household doesn't own firearms, nationally **it is not uncommon for children to find a firearm** unattended outside, come across a gun at others' homes, or even see a gun hidden on school property.

To help prevent a dangerous accident, teach your children that if they see a gun:

1. Stop.
2. Don't touch.
3. Get away.
4. Tell an adult!
